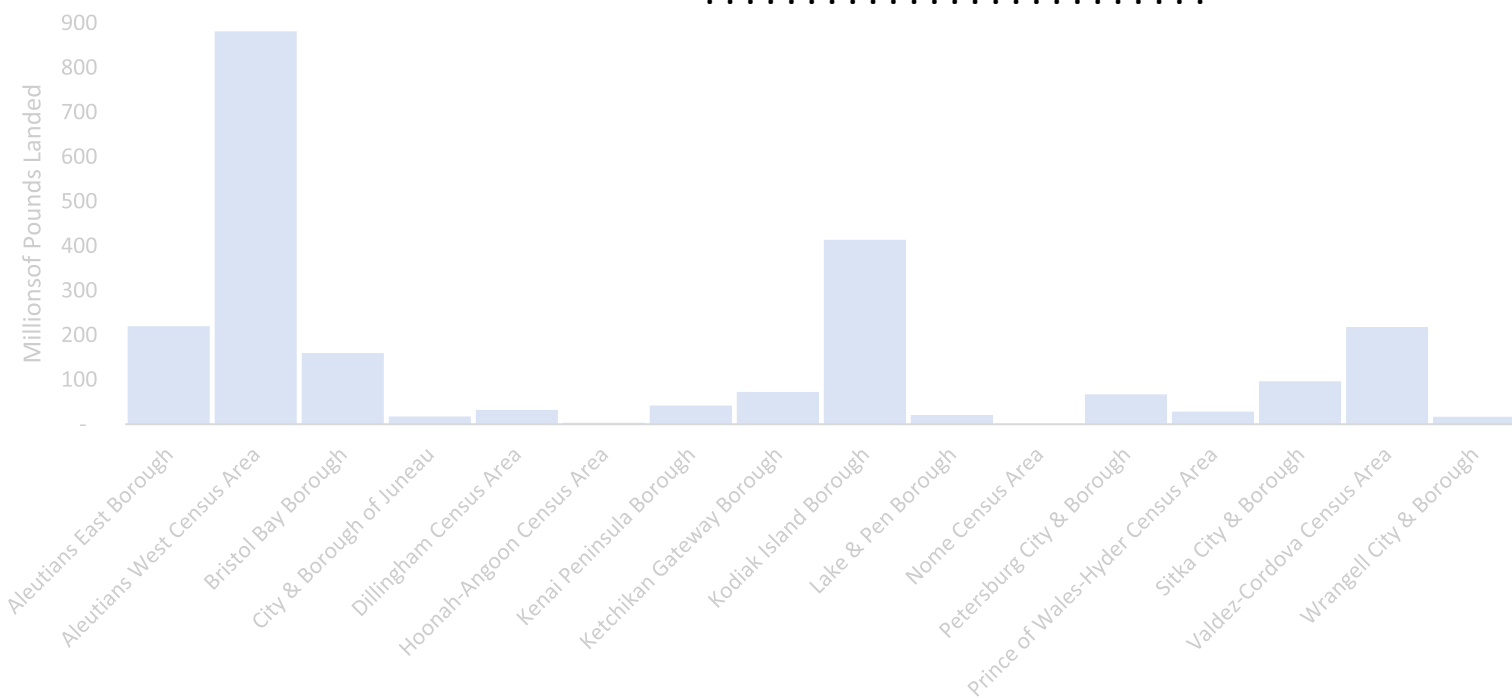

Notes on content of this document:

1. Fisheries landing data includes only fish delivered to shore-based plants in each respective Borough or Census Area (see map above for location of Boroughs or Census Areas).
2. Fisheries landings data is confidential if there are three or less vessels or processors contributing to the data set. If data is confidential then it is not reflected in the charts. For example, halibut is landed in Juneau but because the landings data is confidential halibut does not show up on the pie chart for the Juneau area.
3. Data presented in the community-level pie charts does not include Catcher Processor (CP) landing information. Substantial landings are made by CPs in the Bering Sea Aleutian Islands, as well as in the Gulf of Alaska, which is a big contributor to statewide landings.
4. Information provided for fishing permits does not include crew licenses. For example, a vessel captain usually has a permit which allows them to participate in specific fisheries throughout state and federal waters around Alaska, and these permits are included in the data. However, the vessel crew (which could number 1-4 people) hold crew licenses, which can be used in any fishery throughout the state, and are not included in the data.

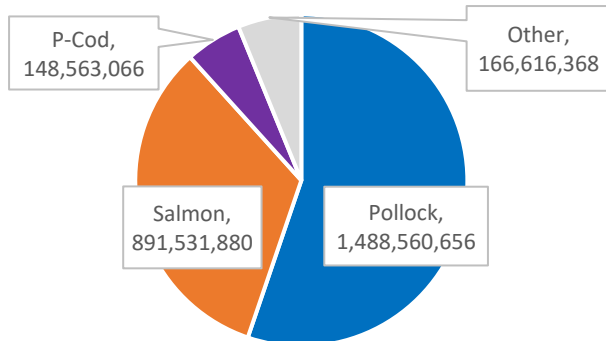

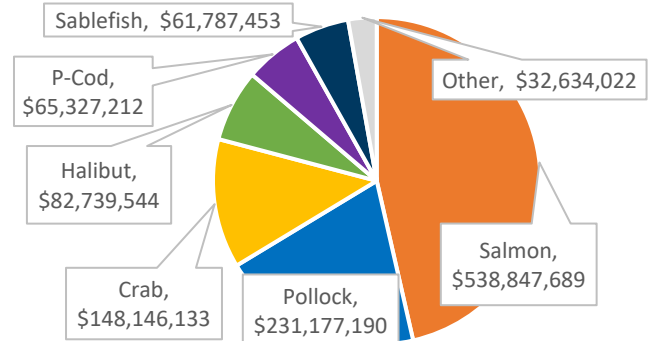

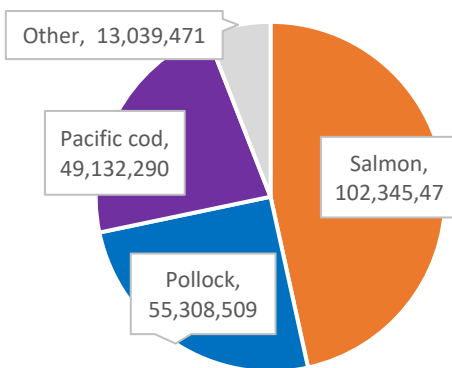

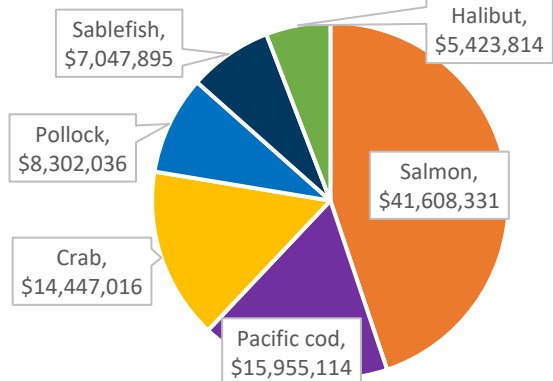

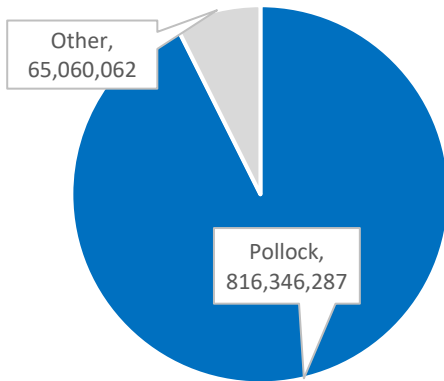

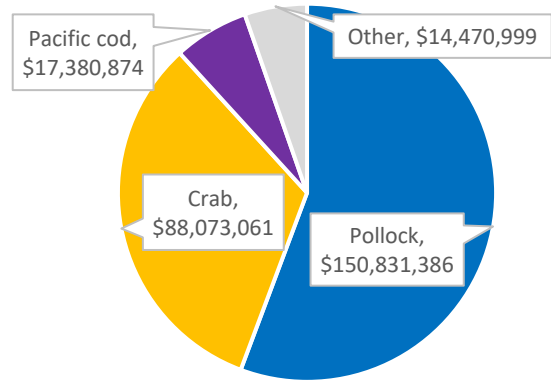

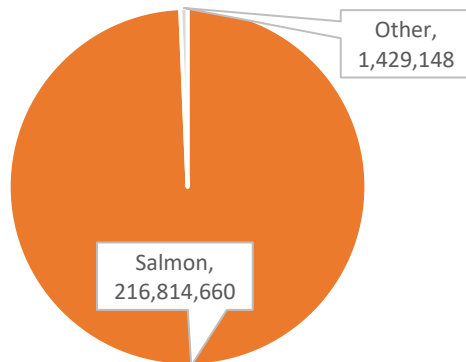

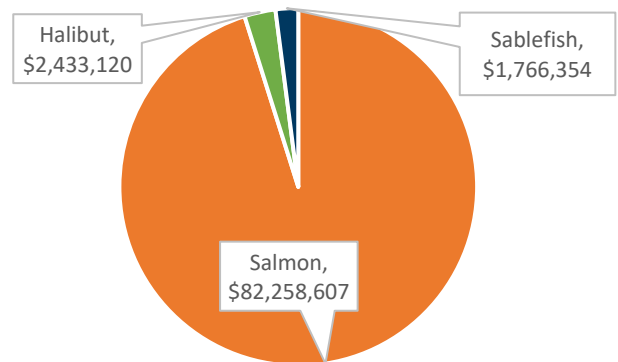

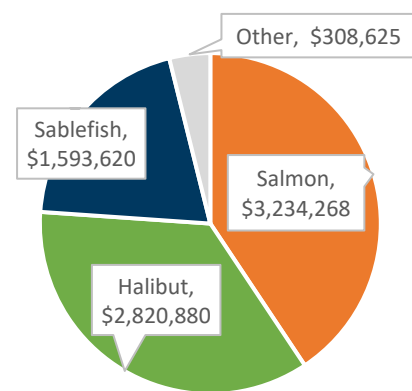

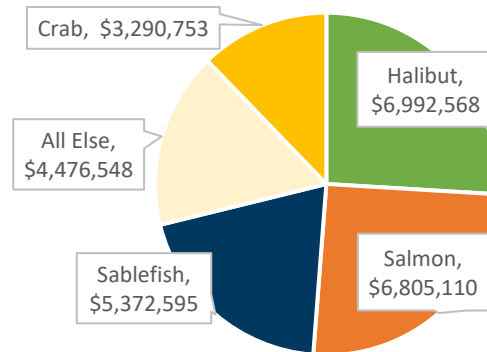

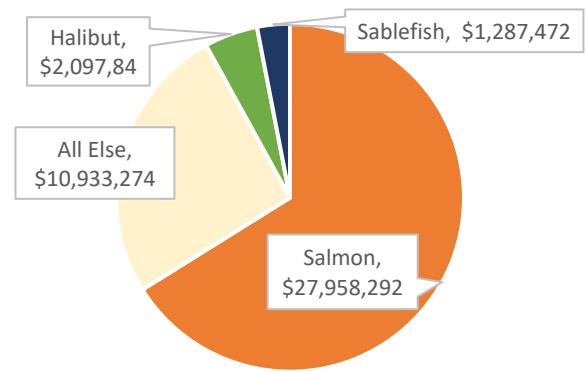

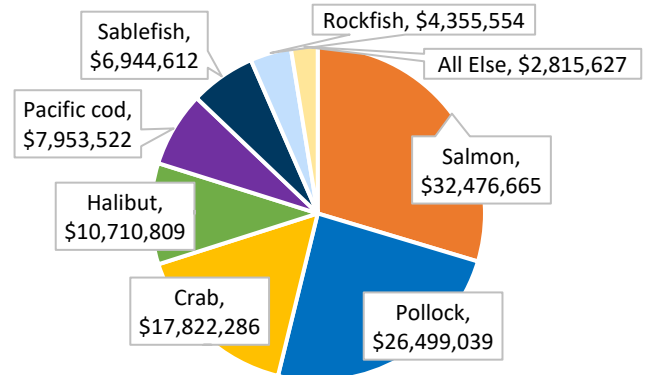

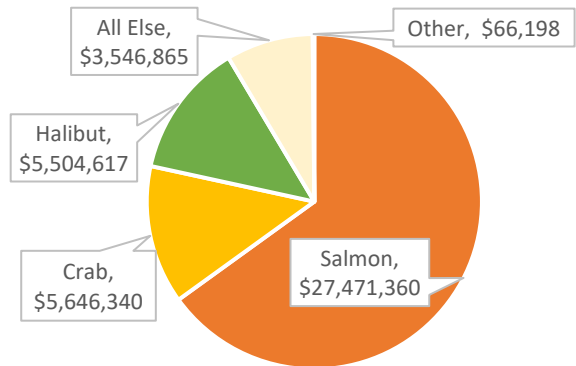
